Why Join?



What does Unify America mean to you and how can you be a positive force in your community to best represent a Republican point of view and demonstrate that you are working towards unifying America?

Unifying America means creating a space where everyone can share their opinions and where civil debate can be fostered. A unified America is an America where the political party system is not so black and white. Right now, every discourse is framed as the Republican side versus the Democrat side, which reflects the disunited state in which our country exists. A unified America would not be split down the middle like it is now but would instead be viewed as Americans with differing opinions, debating for the best interests of the country.

A level of respect once existed in our American political system, but since has diminished. While disagreement and debate are still important tenets for the forward movement of our country, it is important that this debate is conducted in a respectful manner. Republican leaders should debate in favor of the Republican platform but should ultimately make decisions after hearing both viewpoints and deciding which choice is the most logical and beneficial option. Republicans working to unify America should also make compromises for the greater good, while making sure to not completely diminish the Republican viewpoint.

For me, representing the Republican point of view in my own community means bringing back the respect and intellect that once was the dominant force of the Republican party even if it is just on a small scale. Creating an intellectual, engaging, and calm message in support of Republican viewpoints, while objecting to and expressing a disgust for the outrageous comments made by some political figures on both sides of the political spectrum is the only way to gain respect and therefore spread the true message of the Republican party. Certain political leaders do not belong in the Republican party and many political leaders do not deserve a position in office, and this needs to be recognized in order to move forward in unifying America. Rather than working to engage with the extremist outskirts of the Republican party and making attacks on the other side, the Republican message must be geared toward the more general Republicans, who ultimately want to preserve American values and traditions, fight the extremist groups that exist on the outskirts of other parties, and witness a free market with economic stability.

When defending the Republican viewpoint in my community, I will not rely on cheap, polarizing rhetoric, but will instead engage in conversations for the purpose of finding common ground and then working towards compromises on issues that will maintain the integrity of the Republican viewpoint. This may include making others aware of the negative effects of Socialism, while also expressing awareness that there are still changes that need to be made for the improvement of the United States economy. Ultimately, the most important component of unifying America is recognizing that everyone has the right to have their own opinion and that respect is necessary for the constant improvement and unification of the United States.
